 - 19 December - **Operation Safeguard: The Assessment** .
In a world where information moves at the speed of light, terrorists routinely slip into our country largely unnoticed. Where are they? What are they looking for? The Assessment is a fictional account of a terrorist threat to our nation's critical infrastructure.
 - 30 January - **Applying OPSEC to Military Operations: Think Like the Wolf**
In the wild, the wolf studies his prey well before he attacks. And, like the wolf, our enemies are studying vulnerabilities in our operations. Learn how the OPSEC process is applied in a military environment to achieve the element of surprise. To think like the enemy, we must think like the wolf.
- 30 January (double feature) - **Protecting Industry Trade Secrets: Insider Betrayal**
